### Preliminaries

Meeting was called to order at around 2:35pm while opening prayer was conducted by SholoKambi.

### MIN. 1/15/9/2020: REVIEW AND ADOPTION OF THE MALINDI ANNUAL INVESTMENT PLAN FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2019/2020

The Chairman Urban Development, Housing and Public Works tabled the Malindi Municipality Annual Investment Plan (AIP) for 2019/ 2020 FY and the following are the highlights:

#### 1. Malindi Solid Waste Recycling Project

The project which is to be constructed at the existing Casuarina dumping site and would include the following components:-

- i) Provision of waste separation equipment
- ii) Construction of waste collection chambers and
- iii) Waste sorting facilities.

The community and Municipality members of staff would be trained to ensure efficiency of waste management and waste bins will be provided.

#### Expectations

- i) Reduction of the amount of waste sent to the dumping site leading to overall improvement of the environment in Malindi and Watamu Towns
- ii) Municipality cleanliness shall be enhanced leading to increased domestic and international tourism
- iii) Provide employment

- iv) Aid in conserving of natural resources
- v) Value addition to waste by providing products like fencing poles and others
- vi) Production of biogas through organic waste value addition

## **2. Augmentation of Storm Water Drainage Infrastructure at Shella**

This is part implementation of the Malindi drainage master plan and is phase 2 of the drainage at Barani which was done at Barani during the FY 2018/2019. It will begin at the roundabout onwards to Lawfords hotel and will involve expansion of the existing drainage that is narrow most of the way.

### **Expectations**

- i) The perennial flooding will be curbed
- ii) Reduction of destruction to property and minimizing inconveniences to vehicles and human traffic
- iii) Reduction of damages to the road infrastructure as a result of storm water accumulation
- iv) Improve the commercial environment and living standards
- v) Job creation.

After further discussion and having been satisfied with the Malindi Annual Investment Plan for F/Y 2019/2020 that contained the three projects namely:-

- i) Malindi Solid Waste Recycling Project;
- ii) Augmentation of Storm Water Drainage Infrastructure at Shella;
- iii) Upgrading to bitumen standards of the Barclays Mtangani Road
